



The Hawk and the Dove – Guidelines to write a contribution to the text collection

About: The contribution should elaborate upon the author's opinion and why he or she thinks in this manner. It should include a personal experience or expand upon the importance the death penalty plays for the author.

While you can use other texts in the collection as inspiration, there should be no references to any other author's contribution or their opinions included in your article.

Editing: The article might be sent back for clarification or editing according to the guidelines.

Authors whose mother tongue is not English are recommended to have their texts corrected by someone who is originally English speaking before submitting it to the collection.

Signature: The articles are signed with the first name, position with regard to the death penalty (death row prisoner, pen pal, brother of a death row inmate, mother of a victim, etc.), state and date.

Information about the last name, age, profession and city are welcome.

Feedback: Feedback from readers is welcome, but we do not encourage direct feedback to the author.

If I receive feedback, I will forward it to the author without revelation of identity, if the author is interested. I will connect the person providing feedback with the author only if both sides desire.

Rights on articles: The text collection is on the Internet and is thus available to readers all over the world. Texts might be used in another context by other people.
