I have been a prisoner on Texas' Death Row for several years now. We are held in solitary confinement, meaning that we're inside our cells all day, every day, with a few exceptions. We eat alone in our cells. No telephone. No T.V.

For me, it's a little like being in a very strict monastery with a locked door. I do try to be productive and active, in body, mind, and spirit.

They can put me in prison, but as long as I have books to read, they can't put prison in me.
