### Who are the target persons for the project?

If you are a **teacher**, **pastor** or **student who is interested in the death penalty** and all that comes with it, you could be the person to use this project. Other people are welcome as well.


The project is set up to give students or classes of juveniles the opportunity to get in short-term contact with a death row prisoner or with another person concerned with the death penalty. **Three letters** in both directions are sent through the project; there is no direct contact.

### What does the project offer?

Besides the **communication with death row inmates** we will also try to provide you with someone who will come as a **guest speaker** and talk about the death penalty and the living conditions on death row if you wish.

# Who are the inmates who will answer the letters?

The inmates have all agreed to personally answer letters of classes or students through the project. Their motivation is to "give something back to the world" and they don't expect any benefit other than the pleasure of having a limited interaction. You can read texts from the involved inmates in "Inmates speak".



### What can I ask the inmate to whom I write?

All questions about life on death row, the meaning of life and death, and other related topics are welcomed.

#### Who are the people listed under "Other people speak"?

The people listed under "other people speak" are victims' family members, or friends and relatives of death row prisoners. They are all available to write back if you have questions about their experiences.

### How do we start the communication and what will it cost?

The project is maintained by volunteers and is free. However, we ask for a contribution of  $8-20 \in$  for postage for communication with inmates. A communication can usually be started immediately.
